



VIGNETTES BY VIRGINIA

The recent topic of discussion at the Wednesday evening adult prayer and Bible study has been the important subject of prayer. All of us have many burdens and concerns on our hearts and minds. Every day as we listen to the news, read the newspaper and check the internet, we are amazed, and often wonder how such devastating and continuous conflicts can occur in our area and around the world every single day. We do know that it is a reminder to us that God is aware and He is sending His Son Jesus back to earth soon. It is very important that man accepts the gift of redemption and salvation that Jesus provided for us at Calvary. He loves each and every one of us as individuals. What a special blessing!!

The privilege of prayer allows us to share our distresses with God the Father. We also need to be thankful for the hundreds of 'fantastic things' we receive all the time. A former missionary, Wesley Duewel, who happened to enter heaven just recently in March of 2016, spent 25 years in India with his wife Betty. He also was President of the Oriental Missionary Society, the Foreign Missions Association, and editor of *Revival Magazine*. But his greatest BURDEN was PRAYER. He was known mostly for praying for people, and ministry needs more than anything else. A huge part about learning of the security and power of prayer was taught to Wesley by his mother; she also carried an extreme burden of prayer. It is marked on her grave with the word: INTERCESSOR. One of the books Mr. Duewel wrote was "*Touch the World through Prayer*", stressing the need to take prayer seriously.

Looking at a few pages, we start at page 63: "The praying Christ is on the throne of heaven face to face with the Father. But we are weak, finite human beings, saved by the grace of God; Prayer enables us to touch God's throne with one hand and the needy world with the other." page 80: "We know that Jesus spoke seriously to the Father, and so should we. We can rest in God's faithfulness."

Historical examples of people who depended on prayers are: John Wesley, Martin Luther, and interesting note is former President George Washington who arose at 4am each day to spend time to pray.


Page 183 has these words for us: "Once you see the world through Jesus' eyes, prayer for world harvest will be one of the main priorities of your intercession." And page 230, to close: "Pray for God's will above all else."

Check the church bulletins you receive each Sunday and notice the list of prayer needs. (personal note: as a cancer patient, I am so very thankful and encouraged by

the prayers from AROUND THE WORLD.) Other cancer/ physical illness patients have mentioned time and time again that prayers are very uplifting. Also are people who have, years later reported that because we are faithful in praying for him/her - - and sometimes we wonder - - and that articular person has eventually opened his/her heart to the Lord and accepted salvation. He/she has said: "Don't give up praying for me!"
