KOINONIA

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship (Koinonia) of the Holy Spirit be with you all." 2 Corinthians 13:14



In Matthew 16:13, Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" They responded: "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." Then Jesus asked them directly: "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter, replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." A timeless application of this passage is that this is a question that each of us must answer ourselves: who do we say that Jesus is?

However, we must remember that Jesus' identity who he is—isn't dependent on what you and I think of him. Some people think he is myth; others say he was just a good and influential teacher. That may be all he is to them, but his identity as the Christ, the Son of the Living God, doesn't change. He will return to reign on earth and one day every knee will bow, and every tongue will confess that he is Lord.

We rightly highlight Jesus was more than just a good man and even miracle worker. He was and is the Son of God, God with us, the second person of the Trinity, that to see Him is to see the Father. This aspect connects with his substitutionary death, that only one who is fully God and fully man could pay for our sins. Yet, we can easily overlook his title of Christ or Messiah.

You cannot study the background of the New Testament without reading about the Jewish expectation for the coming Messiah—often limited to restoring the nation of Israel and overthrowing the Romans and solving a temporal issue of injustice. However, when correcting for this misunderstanding we cannot reduce Jesus' kingship to just a defensive action in payment of sins. Jesus' response to Peter is telling: "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."

The discussion of this verse is often the debate on the significance of Peter. It is of interest that the Greek for Peter means stone, while the rock (on this rock I will build my church) is a related Greek word that means bedrock or massive rock. It is therefore a legit interpretation that this rock wasn't referring to Peter, but to his profession that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God. Whether the rock refers to Peter himself, his confession, or Christ as the foundation, what is clear is that the church is built upon Jesus' identity.

What is easy to overlook is that the "gates of hell" are the enemy's defenses. Too often the church views itself as trapped inside a fortress, trying to keep the enemy from breaching OUR walls. Instead, the church here is described as the invading army. Christ's church is called to breach the gates of hell and reclaim the territory of the true King. The church is to wage war.

Yet the war we wage isn't to reclaim "Christendom" or gain temporal control over societal institutions. Christ's church reclaims the territory of the King one soul at a time. This happens as people respond to the gospel and receive Jesus as Lord. It happens as strongholds are broken, and as Jesus reigns in our lives and in the lives of others.

The church must not forget that Jesus is the Reigning Messiah. While his ultimate reign is to come when he returns to reign on earth, his Kingdom is a present reality as well. He is not calling his church to hunker down in its fortress—trying to not lose any more ground before he returns. The humility Jesus modeled—and now calls us to—is not at odds with living in humility before the Commander of the armies of Heaven. As our commander, He is calling us to follow Him as He leads the charge into the world, to push back the gates of hell and reclaim the territory that belongs to Him.
