Laubach was a busy, dedicated missionary serving as translator and instructor of the Bible for various dialects in India. Laubach’s goal was to have “a continuous inner conversation with God in perfect responsiveness to His Will.” Here are some edited quotes from Frank Laubach as you live with the Lord minute by minute:

“Can we have contact with God all the time? Can we fall asleep in His arms and awaken in His presence? Can we think His thoughts all the time? I choose to make the rest of my life an adventure of answering this question.”

“This sense of being led by an unseen hand grows on me daily . . . I have tasted the thrill of fellowship with God which has made anything discordant with God disgusting. Good days are when I give my day in complete and continuous surrender to God . . . Nothing can go wrong except that God might be absent in my thoughts. When I surrender to God, I remember how I looked at people with a love God gave. People looked back and acted as if they wanted to go with me.”

Since Jesus enjoyed unbroken communion with God, He will help you and I to do the same. (Lucado edited). Enjoy the gift of this moment with Christ.

- “Are we lukewarm? Do we have a vision? What is NAC Church’s vision for North Huntingdon?” A new vision statement and plan outline is needed for NAC to reach out with the Gospel. An *Ephesians 3:20* prayer group will meet to seek the Lord for this.



The following items were discussed at the Elder and Ministry Board meetings in January:

1. Approved the youth to attend *Winter Jam 2016* at the Consol Energy Center.
2. Approved a Sunday School lesson on Communion.
3. Continuing to contact individuals for Deaconesses, Elders, and Deacons.
4. A Baptismal service will be scheduled for early March 2016.

 - A. A water leak was fixed in the Pastor’s study.
 - B. Additional rock salt for the walks was purchased.
 - C. Donna will perform custodial duties for the entire church.

VIGNETTES by VIRGINIA

February is a month to remember special days: Groundhog day; Lincoln's birthday; Washington's birthday; 2016 has an extra day - February 29th - for Leap Year; Ash Wednesday, thinking of time to celebrate Easter.

2016 PRAYER CHAIN

New 2016 Prayer Chains are in the process of being put together.

What is the Prayer Chain and what does it do?

Those members and adherents of Norwin Alliance Church who wish to be prayer intercessors for the church family are placed on Deaconess' lists. When the intensive prayer chain is activated (for emergency or critical needs of our immediate church family), your Deaconess will call you for your prayers. This chain is also activated to inform of service closings. All other prayer requests are circulated through the Deaconesses and Elder for prayer.

Not all prayer requests go through the intensive prayer chain. As stated above, only emergency or critical needs of our immediate church family are placed on the intensive chain ~ unless the family specifically requests that the full chain be activated. Some prayer requests are of a personal nature and only the Elders and Deaconesses are contacted for prayers.

When calling in prayer requests, if you want the intensive prayer chain activated, please indicate this when calling. In the same manner, not all requests are printed on the Praise and Petition sheet. We try very hard to honor everyone's privacy. If you would like your request printed on the Praise and Petition sheet, please state this when calling in for prayer.

When called to prayer ~ pray as though the need was for a member of your own family ~ we are all a part of God's family.

EVERYONE who would like to be part of the Prayer Chain needs to submit your name and phone number to Judy Himler or the church office by **February 7th**. **If your name is not received, you will not be put on a list**
