In fact, the Israelites were given the Festival or Feast of Trumpets in Leviticus 23:24 which is celebrated in September or October, which marked the end of one calendar year and the beginning of the next.

While our calendar begins a New Year on January 1st, like the Jewish New year, it can be an opportunity for us to reflect on who we are. For us, we can reflect on who we are in Christ. 2 Corinthians 5:17 says that we are a new creation. 1 Peter 2:9-10 says, "But you are a chosen race, a

royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy."

Remembering who we are in Christ is a great place to begin as we seek what the Lord may be asking us to change or do differently in the New Year. If you're reading this and New Year's Day has already passed, it's never too late. God's mercies are new for you each morning.
