June is a busy month for most people. We look forward to the excitement of graduations, anniversaries, weddings, and vacation trips. Some families are even looking forward to the celebration of retirement, or a baby joining the family.

One day of remembrance in June is Father's Day. Many of us enjoy the privilege of the years we have known a very special fellow, we think of as our dad. But it could be a brother, an uncle, a grandfather, a friend. You acknowledge those 'guys' who hold that personal place in your life with memories, conversations, discipline, advisements, lots of time, sometimes tears; stop and thank that very special person while you have the opportunity. Maybe a BIG HUG.

Looking at June from a historical viewpoint, let's review June 14th, known as FLAG DAY. It is interesting to know that Flag Day is a nationwide observance; but Pennsylvania is the only state that recognizes it as a legal holiday. Display of the flag began way back in 1889 for a kindergarten class of the poor in New York City. Many students recognized the flag even though adoption of the flag had not been accepted until May 1937 in Pennsylvania by Elizabeth Gillespie, a descendant of Ben Franklin.

President Wilson in 1916, and President Coolidge in 1927, issued proclamations asking that June 14 be observed as National Flag Day. On August 3, 1949 it was approved in Congress and signed into law by President Truman.

To show respect for the flag, the Pledge of Allegiance was written August 1892 by Baptist minister Francis Bellamy of New York. It was in honor of the 400th anniversary of Columbus Day.

Today the Pledge is 31 words. Many of us can remember President Eisenhower's concerns of 'communist threat' in 1954. UNDER GOD were the words added to the original Pledge. For many years that was no problem for our country. In fact, the wellknown Red Skelton used those two words and an explanation of "What the Pledge Means to Me" in January 1969. His explanation of UNDER GOD is: "Wouldn't it be a pity is someone said, 'that is a prayer" and that would be eliminated from school, too?" (what would he begin to think today if he were here after that message?) It was read twice into the Congressional Record of the United States. Consider the honor of quoting The Pledge of Allegiance. Know why you say those 31 words? Teach children at an early age 'why' and 'how'; some day these wonderful privileges may be taken away. United States of America is definitely a blessed nation. Do Not Forget! Be Thankful!
