KOINONIA

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship (Koinonia) of the Holy Spirit be with you all." 2 Corinthians 13:14



Throughout the four gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John; we can observe countless individuals coming to Jesus for healing. Remarkably there isn't a single example where Jesus sent anyone away without healing them. Some might say, "well, that was Jesus."

Perhaps the passage in scripture that gives us the greatest direction on healing today is James 5:13-16. "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise. ¹⁴ Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working."

Some argue that the ministry of healing that Jesus demonstrated and continued through the lives of the apostles was coming to an end. That these overt miracles were necessary to authenticate the apostolic ministry and establish the early church. However, what these verses describe are guidance of those seeking healing in the church, going to the elders. There is no indication in scripture, that such healing in Jesus' name would come to an end.

While such signs and wonders seen in the early church during the time of the apostles may not seem to be common occurrences, the history of the church on until today have had countless examples of such powerful healings. Why don't we see more?

Perhaps one reason we see less overt healing today is that we aren't seeking it? Indeed, no small percentage of the universal church would be classified as cessationists: those who believe that though God still heals people from time to time, but the miracles we see in the apostolic era have ceased. Among the percentage of the church that holds a continuationist theology, we all too often hold this as a theoretical belief, not a belief that we put into practice.

In James 5 we see that the church is involved, hence those seeking healing would go before the elders in prayer. We see that even lack of confession of sin can be something that hinders healing. This of course does NOT mean that lack of healing is evidence of sin or unconfessed sin. In John 9, Jesus was asked whether the blind man's sin or those of his parents were the cause. He responded, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him."

When we come in prayer for healing, we may not get the healing that we ask for. However, Jesus gives us the healing we need to glorify his name. It may be that he brings emotional healing from wounds or that we truly experience his great love for us. We might even receive the healing we ask for later and through the help of doctors and medicine. Yet, we ask in faith, confident that Jesus will glorify himself in our lives. This could even mean that we receive an answer like Paul received in 2 Corinthians 12:9, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Whatever healing you and I receive when we have need, let us ask in faith, trusting that we will receive the healing that we need.


The stamps will then be sent to the Alliance Stamp Ministry at Shell Point.
