"Marvelous Grace of Our Loving Lord"







#### Crowd Danger

Do not ever follow the crowd, even if the crowd appears to be following Jesus. Follow Jesus only. Let me give you a biblical example.

On Palm Sunday, "Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, 'Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!' And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, 'Who is this?' And the crowds said, 'This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee.' " (Matthew 21:8-11)

Do you see what happened? The crowds laid out a "red carpet" for Jesus and praised Him. The were hailing Him as the one who would come and sit on the throne of David and take over the world. They saw Him as the Messiah who would overthrow the Romans and be an earthly king; this is what they wanted. But they were shortsighted. He must be the crucified Savior before He becomes the earthly King. Without the Cross, none of us would be in his coming earthly kingdom.

And so, JUST FIVE DAYS LATER, here is what the crowds shouted to Pilate: "They all said, 'Let him be crucified! and he said 'Why, what evil has he done?' But they shouted all the more, 'Let him be crucified!'" (Matthew 27:22-23)

What??? The crowds of Palm Sunday quickly turned into the people of crucifixion Friday. The crowd was fickle; the crowd was evil in their thinking and actions, even though they "appeared" to be right in the beginning. Their hearts were in the wrong place. And compromise soon turned to devastating wickedness.

Will you follow the crowd? Even if the crowd "appears" to be Christian? Or will you follow Jesus only - by listening to His Word and His Holy Spirit and refusing to compromise? Be wary. He is the Only Way. And His way is the Way of the Cross, not the way of the crowd.

Most athletes begin at a very early age; practicing, learning many skills, team requirements and personal commitment with devotion to hours and years of energy, frustration, observation, stress, persuasion, dedication, sacrifice, proficiency, intelligence, accommodation, HONOR, PAIN - - - you can add to the list.

In today's history, people around the world are so willing to suffer, often give their life, to serve the Lord and be a testimony for Jesus. That seems a little strange in the United States even though our society has changed quite a bit recently; we can testify since "government" have allowed many changes without looking into God's Word for direction. Our armour in Ephesians 6:10-18 gives protection, safety and guidance.

The Bible has verses for the athlete: *"Run to receive a prize"* I Corinthians 9:24; *"Run with patience"* Hebrews 12:1; *"A strong man runs a race"* Psalm 19:5.

Other verses: I Peter 2:11, 17; 3:7; Hebrews 12:1-2; and Isaiah 40:31. Look to find more - - - depending on the version you use. WARNING: Satan tries to defeat you. As a Christian, as a believer in Jesus, you are already on the winning team! ! Yea! !

Encourage others. Pray for one another. A word we often use in church here - - - FELLOWSHIP.
