Beginning April 27 and throughout the month of May, we will be sharing Mission and Vision statements for Norwin Alliance Church. The elders and other leaders in the church have been praying about our mission and vision and are excited to share this with you. However, before sharing these statements, it's helpful to know what mission and vision statements are.

A mission statement defines an organization's purpose and reason for existing. It communicates what the organization seeks to accomplish on a continual basis. It gives guidance to its daily operations, decisions, and priorities. A strong mission statement provides clarity, focus, and a sense of shared responsibility among members of the organization.

A vision statement describes the desired future or ultimate impact an organization aspires to achieve. It offers a compelling picture of what success will look like over time. It helps inspire and motivate people toward a shared long-term goal. A clear vision statement helps an organization align their efforts and endure challenges with a sense of hope and direction.

Having such statements for a church must be formed on God's clear commands. These statements should never just be OUR mission and OUR vision of what WE want to do or become. Rather, they are to reflect the mission and vision that GOD gives to us. Such statements must not contradict or neglect God's timeless and universal call for his church. At that same time, such statements guide specific local expressions of Christ's church to fulfil His unique calling for them in their local context.

Therefore, such statements are not timeless but reflect the current cultural climate. Just as our denomination's global mission strategies consider the ever-changing mission fields, so must we. New statements do not invalidate past statements. Rather, new statements reflect changes in the internal and external culture that an organization or church finds itself in. As culture and

context changes over time, God leads His people to reexamine the specific call He has for us.

Our Mission and Vision statements are intentionally short and memorable, while the included Discipleship Map helps unpack the specifics of these statements. Our prayer is that our church, of which Christ is the head, moves forward together in unity—that these statements are not just clever branding, but are tools that help us fulfil both God's universal call for His church and the specific ways He desires to use us to impact His kingdom. Would you join us in praying for our church? Here are our Mission and Vision statements, as well as our Discipleship Map:

### Norwin Alliance's Mission:

Making disciples who grow, serve, and witness through word and action.

#### **Our Vision:**

To see a Spirit-empowered church of all generations making disciples who make disciples.

#### **Our Discipleship Map:**

**Who:** We are all called to be disciples who make disciples.

**What:** We obey Jesus in love, embracing His command to make disciples.

**When:** We make disciples from conversion onward, our witness deepening as we grow in Christ.

**Where:** We make disciples locally, regionally, crossculturally, and to the ends of the earth.

**Why:** We make disciples because this was the mission that Jesus gave His church.

**How:** We grow as disciples through worship, God's Word, prayer, intergenerational community, service, and incarnational witness.

# **Live Streaming Change**

Beginning <u>Sunday, April 27<sup>th</sup> at 10:45 AM</u>, we will switch to <u>YouTube</u> for live streaming of our worship services, instead of on Facebook.


