- is a great help in depression and grief.



Vignettes by Virginia

This is a very personal 'testimony'. I spoke with Pastor Bob, asking his permission to share with you. I try to remind myself every day when I wake up to be thankful for life and breath. I am starting my fifth year with cancer. (When the doctor presented that diagnosis, he told me only 3 or 4 months to live. Believe it or not, the doctor was almost in tears as he talked to me.) Usually before I get out of bed I thank my Lord for salvation, protection, life, and blessings He has given to me. Even if I do not have a decent night's sleep, I need to remind myself that God is in control, He loves, knows what will happen that day, and no need to be afraid or worry. Trust - -Trust - - Trust.

I am so very grateful that God is my Healer and Great Physician. I know that I could be really ill; considering medical information, I have been mostly well and nothing seriously out of control. Actually this has been harder on me emotionally than physically. I am thankful for fantastic doctors and educated, skilled personnel of many different technologies.

Satan tries to defeat and discourage me. (Does that ever happen to you?) I know Jesus is in control no matter how defeated I feel. I try to remember a special verse, or song that keeps me on tope of emotions or discouragements. That is often, unfortunately. God is patient with us. This cancer 'disease' has really made me stop to remember my blessings and privileges. I ask God for patience and guidance, and thank Him for healing, protection, security, sacrifices, and love. My life verse is Isaiah 40:31; verse for 2017 is II Timothy 1:7. A special verse for the newly elected President and Vice-President is Romans 13:1.

I appreciate the prayers of so many people around the world. As mentioned above, I do not know WHY I am still alive when I have been very close to death several times. Growing up with a blood disease and knowing if I pricked myself with a diaper pin when changing one of my baby's diapers way back in 1970's and 1980's (no disposables back then), I could bleed to death so very quickly and easily. I had to be extremely careful. Then we found out the same disease ran in the family. Son Jason spent a lot of time in the hospital; we had to be careful with the girls also. God was very loving in that situation also.

I could write more and more. When I read the daily newspaper I realize how short life can be -and how blessed I really am. When I get discouraged, and it is often I miss my earthly family and friends, I know that one day I will see them again. This sounds sad; many folks feel that same way, have the similar emotions. Count your blessings ! ! ! Enjoy pleasant surroundings ! ! Recently I played the little chorus, "Jesus Loves Me" for the offertory. It is a basic song we teach little children, actually very easy to learn. BUT do we take that message into our life? John 3:16, the best of the best and something we need in our life to have peace, comfort, love, strength, and salvation.

As the new year enters our calendars, I will share a poem that I wrote in June 2017 and was very surprised to WIN in a poetry contest October 2017. I know that every one can personally be reminded of God's love and goodness. Salvation is a treasure and gift. Jesus will return very soon. Share God's Word. The poem I wrote is a constant reminder that Jesus is a source of exaltations. I trust that you can also recognize God's daily blessings. Be thankful. Jesus loves you. I know that He loves mell!!

The following items were approved at the Elder's and Ministry Board meetings in October:

- 1. Approved Shelli investigating taking the youth to the Ligonier Center again. Discussed the importance of still encouraging youth to attend the LIFE conference.
- 2. It was approved to purchase a new "server" for the church with 2 new back-up hard drives from NETtrak.
- 3. Our expenses in September were higher than our receipts by nearly \$7,000.00. This in part could be due to no offering being taken during Church in the Park and the many expenses for the day.
- 4. Trustees reported on the long list of items that need to be cared for in and around the church. A couple "mold" specialists have been contacted to look at the Sanctuary ceiling. 2 roof companies have also been contacted to look at the roof. We are still awaiting recommendations.
- 5. A concern came from the congregation that there are times when no greeters are present at the doors in the small narthex. This will be looked into.
