Romans 8:26 says, "the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words." The Holy Spirit is also central to our individual and corporate prayer life. This promise serves as an encouragement when we pray. Not only does God know what we are trying to pray for, the Holy Spirit takes an active role in aiding our prayers. Further, in Romans 8:27, Paul says that "the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God." In a sense, the Holy Spirit fixes our prayers so that they are in accord with God will. This should take the fear out of prayer, wondering if we are praying the "right way."

We live in an individualistic culture. Like all people, our default tendency will be to read and apply scripture through our cultural lens. It would be a sign of the times for western believers to take *helps us* and *intercedes for us* in Romans 8:26 and to individualize these promises. If we don't stop to think about our cultural lens, we will read this promise as *helps us individually* and *intercedes for us individually*. While the Holy Spirit's intercession is available to us as individuals, his intercession is promised to us in community and corporately as well.

1 Corinthians 6:19 is a very well-known and quoted passage: "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit." Quoted less frequently is 1 Peter 2:5: "you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." I believe this is because being an individual temple resonates with our individualistic culture more than being built together does. Yet, if there is a central

passage in scripture on prayer, it must be where Jesus overtly said to *pray like this* in Matthew 6:5-14, which we typically refer to as *The Lord's Prayer* but could arguably be called *The Disciples' Prayer*.

Notice that Jesus says, "Our Father....give us this day....and forgive us...as we forgive those....lead us not into temptation..." Jesus could have given this format instead: "My Father.... give me this day.....forgive me... as I forgive....lead me not..." However, Jesus taught us not only how to pray in solitude, but in community.

While we can and do recite this prayer corporately, we can also use the Lord's prayer to guide our general prayer life. This prayer reminds us of the intimate restoration we have with our Heavenly Father, our need for forgiveness, the need to have soft hearts that forgive others, to pray for our own and others' needs, and to seek the furtherance of his kingdom or our own agenda.

Did you catch what I just said? In saying our prayer life, I bet your mind interpreted this as my prayer life or each of our individual prayer lives. We cannot neglect the importance of praying with other believers. James 5:16 says, "confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working." Jesus can use the vulnerability we have between ourselves and other believers so that we show the love of Jesus to each other.

Jesus said in Matthew 18:19-20 "Again I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." While believers are individually indwelled by the Holy Spirit, we often experience his manifest presence together in community, especially in the context of praying together. Let me encourage us to not neglect praying together!

#### **VIGNETTES by VIRGINIA**

Having given much thought on the significant importance for Christian believers in today's hectic environment, it is obvious that we are reminded and encouraged to PRAY, the main discernments being blessings, encouragement, strength and worship. Being aware of Christians around the world praying for each other is comfort and joy; but personal knowledge of God's love and salvation are available to everyone, everywhere.

I Thessalonians 5:17 reminds us to 'pray continually'. First missionary Paul had the privilege (and responsibility) to teach in many countries - AD 46 to AD 60. His lessons about prayer and the motivation of the Holy Spirit dwelling in the believer's soul was to encourage, comfort, guide, convince and intercede for us. (cf: for Pastor Charles Stanley with notes from Ephesians 3:14-19)

Sue Pott, Editor of *Mission Frontiers*, (March/April 2024) noted that more than ONE million people live in unreached people groups around the world. A group of missionaries met to share their ministries. The remark was: "There are no easy answers. We cannot expect to create a recipe for completing the task of world evangelization simply because we gather to talk about it. Likewise, we cannot hope to see the task completed without investing serious thought, prayer and discernment to the many changing factors at play in the world today, looking for opportunities that only God can reveal, as we ask Him to lead us."

"To be sure, the progress of the Gospel over the past 50 years is astounding!! We are witnessing remarkable growth because of the focus on unreached peoples fueled by prayer." "We all rub shoulders at the throne of grace, asking God to bring His kingdom."

Most of us are aware how God answers our specific prayer requests. We find JOY, PEACE, RELAXATION, TESTIMONY, ENERGY with that response. Be ready and anxious to share that devotion to another person. God loves each and every one of us.

John 3:16; Colossians 1:9-14, prayer for a discerning spirit; Romans 12:12, be faithful prayer; and Philippians 4:6&7, be prayerful and thankful in everything.

Close with a prayer by Charles Stanley: "Help me remember Your truth sets me free and You'll never leave me to face anything alone. I trust you, God, of all comfort. In Jesus' name. AMEN."
