On a day when a large percentage of my time was in a seated position, the movement was good for me. Choosing thankfulness truly was a choice. It turned what could have been "one more thing on my plate" into a peaceful time in God's presence.

Hopefully, I choose the same attitude when I do chores tonight and tomorrow. No doubt, time to be still is a need we have. However, I'm learning that peace and rest are available in unlikely times and places. I'm realizing that I often dread light physical work because it produces a type of silence that leads to worry. Most of the time, I loathe such work, not because of its difficulty, but because it interferes with the ways I want to distract myself: TV, phone, news, books, etc. My prayer is we choose to use those times of simplicity as opportunities to be still before God.
