KOINONIA

"The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship (Koinonia) of the Holy Spirit be with you all." 2 Corinthians 13:14



I once knew a pastor who had a plan to preach through the entire Bible every twelve years, one chapter each Sunday. He was extremely passionate, even obsessive, with preaching through the whole counsel of God. With 1189 chapters in the Bible, the math didn't add up. Even if he preached through the plan all 52 weeks a year, it would take 22 years to preach. He did plan to skip long genealogies and lists, But I'm not sure how he was able to shave off 520 chapters and still claim to preach the entirety of scripture.

I wondered how many individuals were even hearing what he defined as the "whole counsel of God." Even his growing church had significant annual turnover, with fewer than a dozen were there for all twelve years. Further, a high percentage of the congregation missed a couple services a month. In terms of the depth and quality, he often had to fly through dense chapters in one message that most pastors would spend several weeks on.

I share this true story to highlight the importance of believers each taking an active role to know and obey God's word. A person who desires to know the whole counsel of God won't get there by waiting for his pastor to preach through all of it. As God's word are for us to live by, we can't wait 22 or even 12 years to hear it all for the first time.

In September, we spent a Sunday in Acts 17:10-15. We learned how the Bereans examined the scriptures daily to see if Paul's message was true. If the average adult spends 15 minutes a day reading the Bible, they could read through the entire Bible in a year. Suppose you read a little on the slow side and want some extra time to pray and reflect on the passage? Then 30 minutes a day would get you through the entire Bible in a year. If you missed as often as you remembered,

you'd get through the Bible in two years. If you did this reading every other day for 12 years, you'll have thoroughly read, reflected, and prayed through the entire Bible six times! What's stopping us from doing this?

Having a plan helps. The simplest way to do this is to read three chapters a day and you'd finish in just over a year. Reading two extra chapters a week ensures you finish in under a year. You could just read Genesis through Revelation but could also read the books out of order. For example, reading Genesis, Exodus, then Matthew in the New Testament, before moving on the Leviticus.

Another approach is to find a bible-in-a-year bible, that simplifies this for you. These can be read through from January 1st through December 31st, but there's nothing wrong with starting on October 1st. Another great resource is the Mission 119 mobile app, which you can download for free on your phone. It provides an audio reading of a passage of scripture with a daily audio devotional by John Soper, an Alliance Pastor. The Bible reading and devotional take about 20 minutes combined. His plan takes about a year and a half.

I would encourage you to follow an organized plan if you've struggled to consistently study the Bible on your own. To some degree you also need to find a plan that works for you. If trying to finish a plan in one year is challenging, consider trying to complete the plan in two years.

If you struggle to stay consistent, that's ok. Today is a new day. Reading God's word is investing in your relationship with God. The time you spend investing in that relationship will be a blessing to you. The goal is for you to begin to draw near to God and seek His voice daily, not to simply get through the bible in a certain amount of time. Don't believe the lie that struggling to read the Bible consistently is a reason to stop trying. Rather, every day you choose to spend time with God in his word blesses and shapes you.
