If you read through any of the gospels, you would notice that Jesus asks a lot of questions! Good teachers know how to ask good questions. In fact, many of the greatest lessons from our teachers came not from information they gave us, but from questions they asked us that we had to wrestle with. In Matthew 16:13 Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" To this first question, they said, "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." Yet Jesus had a more penetrating and personal question to ask.

In verse 15 Jesus responded to their factual and impersonal answer by asking, "But who do you say that I am?" Notice that any of his disciples could have spoken up. If they wanted to, they could have huddled together to come up with a collective answer. Was Jesus more than what the crowds thought? Peter doesn't wait for group consensus but speaks up for himself: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

Of course, this narrative could have been a lot shorter if Jesus hadn't asked that second question. After the disciples told him what they crowds said of him, he could have responded, "Actually, I'm the Christ, the Son of the living God." Jesus could have said much more about himself and things he would state at other times, such as calling himself the way, the truth, and the life, like he does in John 14:6. He could have given more details, such as that he is also the Good Shepherd, the Door, the Prince of Peace, the Word of God, and so on.

Jesus wasn't asking what they thought of him because he was unsure of who he was. What his disciples needed was not more factual information about him. A time was coming when following Jesus would cost them much more. When that time came, they would need to know who Jesus was to them personally. Is he just a man, a great teacher, a prophet, or is he the Christ, the Son of the living God? When persecution came, each of them would have to answer that question themselves and group

consensus would not give them the resolve to continue to follow him.

By answering the question out loud, Peter wasn't just passively agreeing with facts that someone spoke. They were his words and his conviction. His confidence was strengthened by answering the question himself. We must do the same. It is good for us to know what the Bible says about Jesus. We should have good theology. In fact, in verse 17 Jesus praises Peter for his truthful statement: "Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven."

Yet, salvation doesn't come until we receive Jesus as our Lord and Savior. Knowing facts about him, even true facts, will not bridge that gap. Likewise, answering who Jesus is ourselves strengthens our resolve as we continue to follow him. In your time of prayer, I encourage you to answer that question. Even better, declare who he is to you out loud.

The September meeting of Norwin Alliance Keen-Agers will be on Thursday, September 26<sup>th</sup> at **11:00** am.


The meal will be Heritage Foods, vegetables, salad, dessert. Please bring your favorite heritage food or side to share.


#### Wednesdays at 6:30 pm

#### Women's Corner

Psalm 16:3 As for the saints who are on the earth, "They are the excellent ones, in whom is all my delight."

My favorite Bible translation is the New King James Version (copyright 1979, 1980, 1982 by Thomas Nelson, Inc.) I just included this last sentence because I'm nerdy like that! Well, anyway, I was looking through the Psalms trying to decide which one I should read. I came upon Psalm 16 and decided to read it. When I read verse 3, it just captured my attention. The Psalm had the heading "The Hope of the Faithful, and the Messiah's Victory." Although it is considered a psalm of lament, a note at the bottom of the page stated that "This poem of David became central in the preaching of the apostles in the early church." Another source (Enduring Word Commentary) said that "David delighted in the people of God; their failinas. scandals. despite all embarrassments." All I can add to this is that when I read this verse, I immediately felt uplifted. So many people, Christians and non-Christians, are talking about how things have changed in our society, in our schools, in our communities, and just about everywhere else. But with this verse, I want you to know that no matter how things change God still considers us as His saints. He is with us all the time. You are never truly alone. God loves us that much! Right now, in 2024 we are considered the excellent ones! Have you ever considered yourself excellent? I, certainly, am not excellent. But because I love Jesus and follow him, God looks at me and you as excellent. Don't ever forget that God loves us and won't desert us. Look at another verse, this one is from Psalm 146:1, 2. "Praise the Lord! Praise the Lord, O my soul! While I live, I will praise the Lord; I will sing praises to my God while I have my being." Keep on singing praises to God. He is good!
